Collegiate Challenge offers students the opportunity to spend one week responding to the need for simple, decent, and affordable housing in the United States. During one week of your school break, you can have a drastic impact upon a Habitat for Humanity affiliate, their local communities, and a family in need. You'll have the chance to improve your carpentry skills, connect with new people in new places, and make an immediate difference in Habitat for Humanity's work of eliminating substandard housing.

In the past, members of the UCLA Habitat for Humanity campus chapter have participated in builds in Spokane, Washington and Slidell, Louisiana. In 2005, Slidell Louisiana was one the communities devastated by Hurricane Katrina; 85% of their homes and businesses were destroyed. And in 2008, Habitat UCLA not only rebuilt homes, but also raised hope within the communities.
